forward to participating in the Queen's birthday event at CHALLOW and CHILDREY cricket club on Sunday 26/06/16 2pm-5pm, hopefully I will be able to bring along a marked vehicle, provide some Crime Prevention advice, and do 'hand prints' for the children.

Unfortunately I am holiday for the Garden Fete on Saturday 18/06/16 but I know two of my colleagues from the WANTAGE Neighbourhood Policing team will be coming along, especially when I mentioned 'cream teas'!

Residents have made me aware that they concerned about persons that are going door to door trying to sell various household goods etc. and will not take 'no' for an answer; they can be intimidating especially for elderly and vulnerable; these persons are commonly known as 'Nottingham Knockers', young lads who go door to door selling household goods. Often they have some form of ID which they display, but this is bogus. They may also hand over a card saying they are deaf / dumb / just out of prison / in the process of being reformed and working towards a better life. They will knock on a door, offering cleaning items, they know to be rubbish, which the householder also knows to be rubbish. That is part of the scam. Many people will purchase items to just make them go away. They often pay a return visit if they think the householder is vulnerable.

We advise residents not to purchase items on your doorstep. If you choose to though we recommend you ask for a pedlar's certificate as these are only issued under very strict conditions. The Pedlars Act 1871 is the legislation that governs the regulation of door-to-door selling. A pedlar's certificate is a certificate that allows a person to trade whilst on foot. Pedlars can travel from door-to-door, place to place or town to town. A pedlar's certificate is obtained from the Chief Officer of the Police from the area where the person lives.

The applicant will require two forms of identification, one with a photograph and the other showing an address where the applicant has lived for at least 28 days. The applicant must be over 17 years of age. This information is used by the police to check the applicants' identity and that they are of good character. The cost of a certificate varies but is around £12- £15.

The certificate is valid for one year from date of issue. Once a certificate has been obtained, they can be used anywhere in the United Kingdom.

Any legitimate person that visits you will always be happy to show you their ID, so, please ask for it; if you have any doubts please call 101 and report it to the police.

Please use 101 to report any 'Non-Urgent' Crime related matters...Report it so that we know about it.

DOG FOULING

Childrey Parish Council take dog fouling very seriously as dog mess is not only

unpleasant but it spreads diseases, which can cause illness and even blindness. Under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 a person who is in charge of a dog must clean up after it when it fouls any footpath, highway, verge or other open space to which the public have access. It is therefore a crime to allow a dog to foul in any public area without clearing it up. Those that fail to do so could face a fixed penalty notice of £50 or prosecution. Here some tips to avoid a fine:

- never let your dog walk far from you as this makes it difficult to see when they foul
- always carry a bag when walking your dog so you can clean up or ask another dog walker if they have a spare bag
- encourage your dog to stay on the perimeters of fields so any fouling does not cause any harm to other people
- don't let your dog roam on its own as it could be taken away as a stray, – microchipping is now required by law.

If you see a dog owner allowing their dog to foul and not picking it up, take details of anything that might help identify them and contact Environmental Protection at env.health@southandvale.gov.uk or 01235 540555.
