Put the kettle on.....the kerbside!

From 5th October in the Vale of White Horse, residents can put out **small unusable** electrical items such as toasters, kettles, irons and hairdryers out with their **grey** bin for recycling. Any tired or damaged textiles or clothes that aren't good enough for charity with their **green** bin for recycling.

Items can be put in a tied carrier bag **next to the bin** on the normal collection day. The service is for unusable and worn out textiles — residents should give anything reusable to charity shops.

Small electrical items are taken to a specialist site in Newbury for sorting, storing and processing into new items. Textiles are taken to a sorting warehouse in East London – any cotton and polyester gets cut into industrial rags, and any wool is shredded and made into felt or new yarn.



Community Policing Update PCSO Howard Pack C9600 Thames Valley Police

It's good to be back out on patrol and meeting residents again after a short absence due to illness.

On a recent 'very wet' Sunday I was with the Police van at WANTAGE Carnival in the Market Square giving out Crime Prevention advice and literature; the children (and some adults) enjoyed getting their hand prints done = lots of messy ink and very useful 'wet wipes' involved. The rain didn't stop it being a very enjoyable and productive day.

Rural Crime

Please can I ask residents to keep a look out any suspicious persons or vehicles near to their Churches as recently there have been a number of thefts from these buildings in the nearby rural areas of Wiltshire, Gloucestershire and Faringdon; I will be patrolling all the Churches on my Rural beat, however, if you see anything you are not happy with please call 101 or 999 in emergencies.

Cruel Hare coursing

Farmers have started to harvest their fields. With this, hare coursing is upon us again and we have already had sightings of suspicious vehicles across the area. Hare coursing is the pursuit of hares using hounds. Participants spread in a line across a field and disturb the hare from its home. They then release their dogs to give chase. A bet is made on which dog will catch the hare first with large sums of money changing hands. The most

obvious sign is a group of vehicles parked in a rural area perhaps by a gateway to farmland, on a grass verge, on a farm track or bridle path. There will usually be estate cars, four wheel drives or vans. They may contain evidence of dogs inside. If you see an event taking place we would advise you not to approach the participants but contact us immediately on 101 or 999 if it is happening at the time.

Operations are regularly in place with many officers patrolling the rural areas to deter rural crimes such as theft of machinery and tools, burglary to barns and hare coursing. Officers will be tweeting throughout the operation on the South and Vale twitter account.
