Community Policing PCSO Howard Pack C9600 Thames Valley Police

This month will be my 10th anniversary of starting work for Thames Valley Police, there have certainly been some changes over the years that have made the role interesting with more changes and new challenges coming along all the time, certainly no two days are the same!

November starts with the Fireworks of Bonfire night which comes just after the clocks have gone back to signal longer, darker and colder nights.

Darker evenings brings me to the subject of 'Lights on Bicycles' and the health and safety of cyclists and pedestrians. For any children using a bicycle to get to and from school I would ask that you or your parents purchase a front and back light and if possible a reflective tabard (Yellow or Orange are good colours) which will increase the riders visibility. Crime **prevention** There has been a recent spate of thefts in Wantage and Grove. Thefts from cars, sheds and garages have been reported. Items have not always been taken, however, some small items and bikes have been taken. Please be extra vigilant, make sure you vehicles are locked, your sheds and garages have heavy duty locks and are kept secure. If you see anyone acting suspiciously in your local area, please call the police nonemergency number 101.

I have been out and about on the GREENDOWN area with my friend 'SID' (Speed Indication Device) carrying out Speed checks. On a recent Thursday, 12:15 to 12.45, on the A417, Main Street,

East Challow, 132 vehicles went through my check point with the highest speed recorded at 35mph. Other locations I have been monitoring are Courthill Road, Letcombe Regis; High Street, Childrey; Holborn Hill, Letcombe Bassett; let me know if there are any other locations where you believe Speeding is a problem? New Policing team member Wantage Neighbourhood Policing Team has a new leader, Sergeant MARK DAVIS has joined us replacing Steve Hookham who has been promoted to Inspector.
